Now for my story. A year ago Sept. 26, I had a mild cerebellar thrombosis and slight shock. It would be a Sunday morning and me alone. When I got out I felt my left side was gone and I fell on the floor and couldn't get up. They got me up to a hospital in Manila and it was so slight I was back the 1st week of Nov. but the left side remained a bit stiff so last June I went home for a check-up at Feakey. They found the right artery was closed up or clotted up - I had been treating for cholesterol. Their opinion was I probably wouldn't live me for another 20 yrs. and was as well off here as anywhere - as I'd been while I was home I also had a bone removed from my ear and my hearing is now fine - so it was worth it. The highlight that made the trip worth while was the folks celebrated their 50th in Sept. and I was able to say the Mass. As the mother says - God does all things well - even if He is a bit rough about it at times. I'm fine now but have to get used to that slight stiffness as they figure it will be permanent. I left home so late I had no time to stop I landed in Paris on Mon. and was on the after flying direct from New York. I was tortured for anything but sleep and so thought it best not to call. I landed in Manila Nov. 1st on time. Sorry to say about Philip's illness but glad he is O.K. My love to Cito Pat & Luis. Tell the others to send you all my best blessings for the New Year. Bill
