I would have sent you a card when I arrived but I couldn't remember your address. I asked Clara last night and she said 931 and then it came back to me.

I like it here and I get good meals. I am waited on hand and foot and get a massage every night. You would all throw a fit if you saw me eating the things I do, but there is never a murmur from my insides so I should worry. I sleep at night, too, and don't wake up near so often as I did at home.

I got up and dressed yesterday for the first time. I was up in my kimono and out in the sunshine for a while on Saturday.

I looked for you, and Gene, too, all day yesterday and I was glad when Clara phoned. There is no phone in this house, so if you want to tell me something, make a person to person call. It

only costs 25¢, while that call last night must have cost 50¢ or more. Some girls were here visiting and drove me over to the other house. If what you want to tell me isn't something private just tell your message to whoever answers the phone and they will come and tell me.

I hope everything is Ok. at home. Urge all of them to write to Helen & Mary often and do it yourself (just as a good example)

Be good and don't worry about me and give my best regards to Mr. & Mrs. Murphy and all the rest of the Murphy clan and especially Johnny.
