Your letters, Katherine, written on June 19th and June 25th were most welcome. It pleased me much to know of the many kindnesses tendered you by Harry and family and also by Arnold and the others. It was thoughtful of Helen and John to invite you for a ride in their new car.

I can just imagine Helen and her Johnny with their happy youngsters going for a joy ride in their new spacious car. I think John is an A number One man of commom sense, good judgment and management. Those dear children in years to come will have happy memories of their childhood days and of their devoted parents.

Yesterday I received a nice letter from Frank. He has been keeping me informed of Austin's condition, which is not so good just now. I understand that all arrangements made by Mary in his regard will be carried out by Clara and himself. We could not wish for anything better for our dear Austin than that God will soon take him to the ternal Home.

Tuberculosis seems to be a more lingering illness than cancer, and even though a patient gets very low he often rallies again.
